





**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE NO.1225**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the **LEWIS COUNTY, Washington Board of County Commissioners** will hold a public hearing on **October 10, 2011**, to receive public testimony concerning adoption of Ordinance No. 1231, extending the effective date of Ordinance No.1225, an ordinance related to land use and zoning and imposing a moratorium on receipt of applications for development of community medical marijuana gardens upon declaration of emergency. The hearing is scheduled to commence on or after 10:00 AM, October 10, 2011, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Lewis County Courthouse, second floor, at 351 NW North St., Chehalis, WA. Anyone wishing to testify concerning the proposed ordinance should attend and be heard.

The following summarizes the proposed Ordinance No. 1231:

An emergency was declared and a moratorium on receipt and acceptance of applications for land use development of any kind requiring County review or approval for community medical marijuana gardens was imposed on August 15, 2011 with the adoption of Ordinance No. 1225. The Ordinance is scheduled to expire on October 13, 2011, sixty days following its adoption. Ordinance No. 1231, if adopted will amend Ordinance No. 1225 to extend the effective date of the ordinance, with an expiration date six months from the date of the original enactment; February 15, 2012. All other provisions will remain in effect.
