The Lewis County Sheriff's Office is releasing the following information pursuant to RCW 4.24.50, which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public when the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the Sheriff's Office. Further, their previous history places them in a classification level that reflects the potential to re-offend. The individual served the sentence imposed by the court and has properly notified the Sheriff's Office of their current address. The law does not require this offender to do anything other than register. **THEY ARE NOT WANTED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AT THIS TIME. Synopsis of Information: In 1994 Vernon plead guilty to the crime of Rape 2nd Degree. The offense involved Vernon sexually assaulting his then girlfriend. Vernon also has an extensive history of convictions for sexual offenses that range from Indecent Exposure to Indecent Liberties with Forced Compulsion. His victims have ranged from minor age females to adult senior age females. They have also involved acts of violence towards those victims. His last conviction was for the crime of Voyeurism in 2003. He was last released from prison on 06/09/08 and will be under active supervision through the Department of Corrections. Because of the type of crimes involved in his original conviction and his continued criminal behavior he presents a high risk to reoffend.



Using this public information to threaten, intimidate or harass sex offenders will not be tolerated by the law enforcement agencies of Lewis County. This abuse could potentially terminate our ability to release this important information to the public.
