ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Lewis County from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the County. We also determined whether the County complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

ABOUT THE COUNTY

Lewis County is home to more than 76,000 residents. Historically a logging and agricultural county, the County's economy is in transition. The County is moving towards a more diversified economy including construction, manufacturing, retail, healthcare, transportation and warehousing, utilities and public employment sectors.

An elected, three-member Board of Commissioners administers the County, which operates on a \$74.6 million annual budget. Its 578 full- and part-time employees provide public safety (sheriff and court services), construction and maintenance of roads and bridges, health and social services, cultural and recreational facilities and services, planning and zoning services and general administrative services.

AUDIT HISTORY

We audit the County annually. The 2007 audit reported a repeat finding for violations of the Open Public Meetings Act. The 2008 audit contained a federal finding regarding internal controls over prevailing wage (Davis Bacon Act) requirements. The 2009 audit was free of findings and previous findings had been resolved. The 2010 audit reported a finding for a lack of internal controls over the preparation of the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards. That finding has been resolved.
