Community Advisory Committee

What is a Community Advisory Committee?

A Community Advisory Committee (CAC) is a group of interested people who meet monthly for up to one year to create the Onalaska Subarea Plan.

The members should be diverse in composition, geography and interests and represent the community of Onalaska as a whole. Members should be “big thinkers” that are willing to collaborate as a group. Members should be interested in engaging with the community and fostering strong, long-term relationships.

What will the Community Advisory Committee do?

The CAC will meet monthly throughout the planning process and is charged with:

- developing the vision(s), policies and goals
- engaging with the community
- identifying benefits and burdens to stakeholders
- reviewing and providing comments on materials
- attending events to keep the public up to date
- providing advice to the Planning Commission

Do you have to live in the subarea plan boundary to be on the Community Advisory Committee?

No. To be on the CAC, you need to have a stake in the outcome of the plan. You might live in the plan boundary. Or you may live outside the boundary and work, shop, go to school, go to church in Onalaska or have another interest in how Onalaska grows over time.

Is there a limit on how many people can be on the Community Advisory Committee?

There needs to be at least 10 people serving on the CAC. The ideal number is 20, but there is no upper limit. More importantly, there needs to be a diversity of views and opinions. A great plan is created when people with diverse ideas come together to collaborate on joint solutions!
