**WHEREAS**, Lewis County Public Works anticipates needing Professional Airport Consultant Services to complete environmental assessments at the Ed Carlson Memorial - South Lewis County (Toledo) and Packwood (55S) airports to support development of projects identified in the respective airport Five Year Capital Improvement Plans (2024 through 2029); and

**WHEREAS**, Lewis County Public Works does not have the required resources to complete the Environmental Assessments for the Ed Carlson Memorial - South Lewis County (Toledo) or Packwood (55S) Airports to support development of the airport projects; and

**WHEREAS**, publication to solicit for professional airport consultant services is needed to contract with a professional airport engineering firm for such services.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that Lewis County Public Works is instructed to advertise an RFQ, evaluate responses, select a consultant, and negotiate a contract for professional airport consultant services, and the Clerk of the Lewis County BOCC is instructed to proceed with all appropriate and necessary notifications, posting, and publication as required by RCW 65.16.

# REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ) FOR PROFESSIONAL AIRPORT CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

#### **PACKWOOD AIRPORT (55S)**

Lewis County Public Works, the owner and operator of Packwood Airport (55S) in the unincorporated community of Packwood, in east Lewis County, Washington, is requesting Statements of Qualifications from qualified firms for Professional Airport Consultant Services to complete an Environmental Assessment (EA) at Packwood Airport (55S) for projects in the 5-year Capital Improvements Plan (CIP). A separate RFQ will be issued later for design and construction services.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

This work is to provide an Environmental Assessment for the airport to support future improvements at the airport to support future design and construction services for projects in the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan for the Packwood Airport in unincorporated east Lewis County, Washington.

The Consultant will follow the guidance in FAA Advisory Circulars, specifically AC 150/5070.1F, Environmental Impacts: Policies and Procedures and 5050.4B, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and implementing instruction for Airport Actions.

Elements of content or inclusion may be, at a minimum:

- Proposed Action
- Purpose and Need
- Alternatives Analysis
- Affected Environment
- Environmental Consequences
- Public Participation Plan
- Relevant Discipline Reports (e.g. wetland delineation, cultural and archaeological surveys, biological evaluation or assessment, noise, and air quality studies
- Mitigation

The approach, level of effort, and tasks and deliverables will be further refined during the scoping process.

Projects on the current 5-year CIP include:

- Partial Parallel Taxiway, Tie Down Apron, and Helicopter Parking Design
- Partial Parallel Taxiway, Tie Down Apron, and Helicopter Parking Construction

#### SELECTION OF THE CONSULTANT

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No cost or fee schedules shall be submitted with your proposal. Consultants will be selected based on their qualifications and experience, with fees determined through negotiations following selection. The qualifications of consultants are evaluated, and the best qualified consultant is selected, subject to a mutual understanding of the scope of services and negotiation of a fair and reasonable fee.

It is the intent of Lewis County to appoint a committee to review the Proposals submitted and rank the qualified firms.

Lewis County may choose to interview a shortlist of consultants before making the selection. The shortlisted consultants shall be notified at least 14 days prior to the interview date.

Lewis County reserves the right to reject all submissions to the RFQ, request clarification, or waive informalities/technicalities, if it is deemed in the best interest of Lewis County. Lewis County assumes no responsibility for costs incurred in responding to this RFQ.

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Submittals that do not address all items listed in this section will be considered incomplete and will be deemed non-responsive by the County.

- 1. Key Personnel (20 Points): Key personnel, including their professional qualifications and experience in conducting airport environmental studies, their role anticipated for the proposed project, and their knowledge of FAA regulations, policies, and procedures. Identify the proposed Project Manager and key project team members and responsibilities. Include any proposed sub-consultants to be engaged by the consultant. Provide a brief resume for each person or sub-consultant, outlining their credentials and experience with similar projects.
- 2. **Qualifications (10 Points)**: Qualifications and experience of sub-consultants to be engaged by the consultant under consideration.

- 3. Experience of the Firm (25 Points): Please provide a list of all current airport environmental projects, as well as any which have been completed in the last three (3) years. List the project manager you assigned to each project. Identify the start dates for all projects, and the completion dates (where completed). Address the capability to perform all or most aspects of the projects and the ability to meet the schedules or deadlines associated with the projects.
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- 7. **References (10 Points):** Provide the name and contact information for at least three (3) references familiar with the quality of work by your firm of a similar nature as contained in the above Scope of Work.

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Consultants desiring consideration shall electronically submit a complete Statement of Qualifications packet for "Professional Airport Consultant Services - Packwood Airport - Lewis County, WA" in OpenGov at https://procurement.opengov.com/signup. Statement of Qualifications must be submitted electronically in OpenGov no later than 4:00 P.M. on Monday, February 26, 2024.
