*Please refer to the Land Capacity Analysis methodology provided to the cities in April. The LCA is based on the existing city limits, UGA and zoning designations. The LCA provides information about how many people can be accommodated over the next 20 years. Next, the Housing Needs Assessment looks at the type of housing allowed by the existing zoning in the city limits and UGA, and reviews that against the Housing Allocations. If the city cannot accommodate the housing allocations based on the existing zoning, then the next step is to consider what changes to zoning designations may be appropriate and where, based on infrastructure, higher housing densities can be accommodated. After changes to zoning designations are considered, it is recommended that the city re-run the LCA using the draft zoning designations to determine how many people the existing city limits and UGA, with new zoning, can accommodate. This exercise of increasing housing density where urban service already exist should be done before considering expansions to the UGA boundary.
