LEWIS COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH 2019 COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSESSMENT

KEY FINDINGS

Demographic & Socioeconomic

The percent of residents aged 16 and over in the workforce significantly decreased from 2013 to 2018.

Health Resource Availability

More Lewis County residents have health insurance; rates of uninsured residents have notably decrease since 2013.

Behavioral Risk Factors

Marijuana and tobacco use has remained stable over the last five years; Lewis County's rate of adults who currently smoke cigarettes remains higher than Washington State's.

Communicable Diseases

Lewis County's rate for many STIs remains below that of Washington State and child immunization rates remain higher in Lewis County compared to Washington State.

Death, Illness and Injury

Incidence and mortality rates for all cancers have decreased over the last five years, including lung cancer, which continues to be the most common cancer and cause of cancer death.

Maternal Risk Factors

Lewis County maintains higher rates of teen pregnancy and smoking throughout gestation than Washington State.

Social & Mental Health

Drop-box usage for election ballots continues has nearly doubled since 2012.

Environmental Health

Public community water systems serve nearly half of all residents; drinking water tested in 2018 was clean of contaminants exceeding safe levels.
