- III. **VERIFICATION OF QUORUM:** A quorum was present with four of the eight members in attendance. RCW 70A.205.110 requires a minimum of nine members. The committee is aware of the membership requirements and working on member recruitment.
- IV. **PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES**: "Motion." Motion made by Robert Spahr and seconded by Max Vogt to approve the April 9, 2025, minutes. Motion Carried.

#### V. PUBLIC COMMENT:

• Lynn Ford with Master Recycler Composters (MRC) came to speak about the MRC Tool Bucket Library, which is now open. The purpose of the Tool Library is to learn about tools before you purchase them, or if you don't have the funds to purchase the tools to use, you can borrow them from the Tool Library. They have partnered with other organizations such as the Clothing and Textile Advisors and Hub City Bike Shop to help with their repair fairs. Max Vogt helped sponsor the first repair fair in April 2023 and is a continuing support for the MRCs. #### VII. BUSINESS AGENDA:

#### B. Reports/Updates:

- SWAC Jason Adams Vice Chair.
  - The last Repair and Sustainability Fair diverted 583 pounds from the landfill. 63 individuals brought
     86 items and 62 knives and tools for sharpening.
  - The lunchtime Learning Series has started again. It is on Zoom from 12-1 pm and they are looking for presenters.
- LeMay/Waste Connections Tom Rupert, LeMay Enterprises, Inc. None.
- Department of Ecology Christina Kullberg, Grants and Planning.
  - The Washington State Public Works Board opened a new funding cycle for local planning and construction projects. Applications are due August 8, 2025. Cities, counties, special purpose, districts, and quasi municipal organizations are eligible to apply.
  - Governor Ferguson signed the Recycling Reform Act on May 17, 2025. This makes Washington State
    the seventh state to enact an extended producer responsibility program for consumer packaging. For

  - For those who are interested in organics, Ecology is updating its Organics Material Management Regulations in chapter 173-350 WAC, Solid Waste Handling Standards. This addresses contamination of food waste, feed stocks, and finished products at organic waste handling facilities. They will be holding a public meeting on Monday, June 30, 2025, from 1-3 pm.
- Lewis County Solid Waste Rocky Lyon, Solid Waste Manager.
  - o Community Litter Program Report April 2025.
    - The Lewis County Litter Crew spent 153 hours cleaning up 38 road miles, 2,160 pounds of garbage resulting in \$50 in other item fees, and \$253 in total disposal fees. Public Works helped do some clean-ups with \$40 in fees. The supplies, vehicle and cell phone fees were \$2,272.
    - The Lewis County Litter Crew also spent 68 hours cleaning up six illegal dumpsites and just under 2,200 pounds. Total disposal fees, including other items, were \$350.
    - The Contracted Litter Crew reported \$4,823 in labor fees for Express Personnel contract workers to help Brett.
    - The Interchanges and Intersections through the City of Centralia cleaned up 76 pounds of litter in 64 hours. \$65 in other items and total labor and disposal fees were \$1,443.
    - Centralia volunteers had 33 volunteers spend 47 hours cleaning up 59 bags of litter. Chehalis
      volunteers cleaned up under Chamber Way and along National Avenue. Three volunteers
      reported ten hours and cleaned up four bags of litter. The Trash Force Volunteers spent 30 hours
      and cleaned up 2.02 tons on Skate Creek Rd.
  - Transfer Station Tonnage April 2025.
    - Tonnage for the month of April was up 259 tons in Centralia from last year at 7,452 tons and down 64 tons in Morton at 857 tons. Total tonnage for 2025 so far is 29,327 tons.
  - The Winlock recycling event was a success. They opened 30 minutes early and recycled over 50 appliances. 75 vehicles came to recycle items. There will be another recycling event in Pe Ell on June 14, 2025, from 10-2 pm. There will also be shredding available.
  - We are closed Thursday, June 19, 2025, for Juneteenth.


February Interchanges and Intersections labor fees had an additional \$7.80 due to a revised January invoice.
