
Growth Management Act (GMA)

- Adopted in 1990
- 15 goals to be balanced
- Requires development of a comprehensive plan and implementing regulations
- Updated every 10 years looking out 20 years








Goal and Policy Revision Methodology

- <u>Growth Management Act (GMA)</u> Recommendations to align policies with recent state legislative changes.
- Regional/Countywide Planning Policies (CPPs) Recommendations to align with policies with CPPs.
- <u>Community Vision</u> Recommendations based on community feedback collected through engagement.
- <u>County Vision</u> Recommendations to align policies with vision of BOCC, PC, Staff, and adopted County plans.
- Administrative Cleanup Recommendations to make the policies clear, concise, and actionable. Clearly identify what is being implemented.

Goal and Policy Changes Summary

Existing	Proposed Change
Land Use – Focuses on land use and urban facilities in Urban Growth Areas.	Revisions focus on future coordination with cities for unincorporated UGAs and the use of subarea plans for Onalaska and Packwood UGAs.
Rural – Focuses on preservation of rural character and rural lifestyles.	Revisions focus on clearly aligning LAMIRD designations with appropriate uses and densities.
Housing – Focuses on housing opportunities in in Urban Growth Areas.	Revisions focus on new accommodation of housing in Onalaska and Packwood UGAs and the use of subarea planning efforts. Focus on equal housing opportunities, supporting low income, and vulnerable populations.
Transportation – Inventory of transportation system and establishing LOS standards.	Revisions focus on resilient transportation systems including and integration of multi-modal planning for bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure.



Goal and Policy Changes Summary

Existing	Proposed Change
Capital Facilities / Utilities – Focuses on County- owned facilities and planned improvements.	Revisions focus on additional support for broadband, where feasible, and possible funding sources for capital facility improvements to make County facilities more resilient.
Resource Lands – Focuses on the administration of agricultural, forest, and mineral resource lands.	Limited revisions have been proposed for this element.
Economic Development – Focuses on expanding natural resource industries, workforce, and job opportunities for residents.	Revisions focus on resilient economic opportunities.
Parks and Recreation – Focuses on the administration and planned improvements for parks.	Limited revisions have been proposed for this element.



Climate & Resiliency Element

The Climate & Resiliency Element must:


- Identify, protect, and enhance natural areas to foster resiliency to climate impacts;
- Identify, protect, and enhance community resiliency to climate impacts; and
- Address natural hazards created or aggravated by climate, including sea level rise, landslides, flooding, drought, heat, smoke, wildfire, and other effects of changes to temperature and precipitation patterns.


