- VII. Transfer Station Operations Presented by Rocky Lyon, Solid Waste Manager.
 - a. Community Litter Program Report September.
 - The litter program supervisor spent 30 hours, and the crew spent 59 hours cleaning up 18 road miles, cleaning up 1,220 pounds of garbage.
 - 13 Illegal dumpsites had 48 supervisor hours, 95 crew hours, 4,500 pounds and \$715 in disposal fees.
 - Contracted Litter Crew total was \$4,463.
 - Centralia reported 37 volunteers spent 50 hours cleaning up 55 bags of litter cleaned up. Four volunteers worked for four hours on Airport Road collecting 12 bags. Chehalis reported one volunteer cleaning up a truck load off National Avenue. Gifford Pinchot Trash Force reported cleaning up three TV's and a truck load in the woods in Randle.
 - b. Transfer Station Tonnage September.
 - The Central Transfer Station monthly total was 7,280 tons.
 - The East Lewis County Transfer Station monthly total was 963 tons.
 - Year to Date Central Transfer Station total is 62,124 tons and East Lewis County Transfer Station is 7,459. The combined total for the year was 69,584 tons.

 - Fund 4150 beginning balance was \$6,794,739. Revenue per the Munis report was \$1,036,142 with expenses of \$916,116 and showed a net operating gain of \$120,026. The ending fund 4150 balance was \$6,914,765.




