- III. Minutes from Regular Meeting of March 22, 2021

Motion by Gary Stamper and seconded by Lindsey Pollock to approve minutes of the March 22, 2021 regular meeting. Motion carried.

Resolution #002-21- Approval of an extension to our current contract for solid waste transportation and disposal with Harold Lemay Enterprises, Inc. / Wasco County Landfill. To take effect April 1, 2021.

Motion by Gary Stamper and seconded by Lindsey Pollock to approve Resolution #002-21. Motion carried.

VI. <u>Transfer Station Operations</u>

- A. Community Litter Program Report 17 illegal dumpsites reported. Utility is still unable to access offender labor to conduct normal litter control program. Still seeing many tires at illegal dump sites. Solid Waste Utility is planning several tire events in May and June.
- B. Transfer Station Tonnages total tonnage for March was 7,923 tons. This was 23% higher than March of 2020. Customer count was also up by 34% compared to this time last year.
- C. Recycling Update *Recycle Reset* continues and staff has notices a decrease in contamination. All recycling materials are going to market with metal being our highest commodity at \$160 per ton.

VIII. Financial Reports

- A. <u>Disposal District and Utility Income Statements</u> The District's statement showed a net revenue of \$109,039 for March of 2021, and the ending balance of District Fund 415 was \$3,136,953. Increased expenditures for the month were the hauling and disposal to the landfill, professional services for our feasibility study and hazardous waste disposal.
- B. Approval of Transfers from Solid Waste Disposal District #1 to Lewis County Solid Waste Utility

 Motion by Gary Stamper and seconded by Lindsey Pollock to approve payments and transfers in the amount of \$679,892. Motion carried.
- IX. Staff Discussion
 - A. Voucher Program Planning The voucher program planning was tabled for a later date.

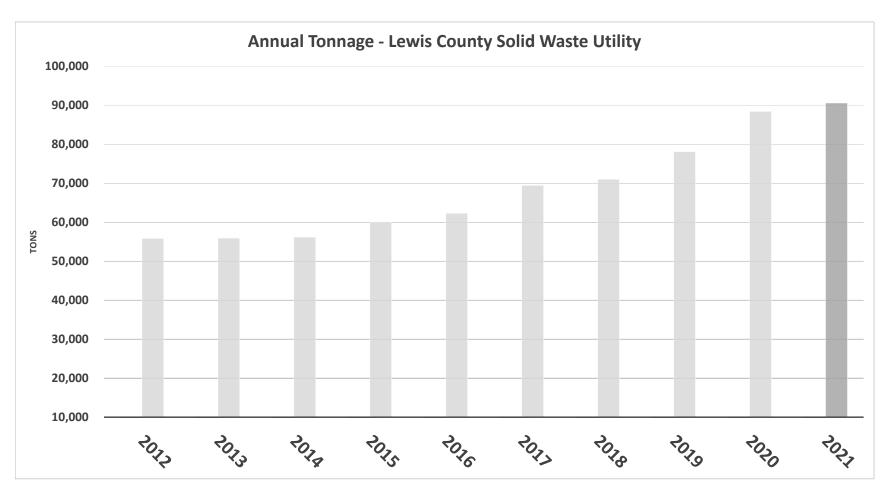

^{*}Breakdown of building/facility rent: CTS monthly rent is \$51,000 and the ELCTS montly rent is \$1859. CTS monthly rent payments increased from \$38,700 to \$51,000 in Jan. 2010. \$38,700 goes toward a bond payment and \$12,300 is reserved in Solid Waste Fund 401 for capital improvements. Per BOCC Resolution #11-439, when the bond is fully paid in Dec. 2024, the entire \$51,000 payment will be reserved in the Solid Waste capital improvement reserve.
