

COVID-19 WEEKLY UPDATE

Lewis County, WA | Reporting Week for June 17, 2022 to June 23, 2022

The COVID-19 vaccine is available to all people 5 years and older!

The first diagnosed case of COVID-19 in a Lewis County resident was reported on March 15, 2020.

As of June 23, 2022, Lewis County reported:

- 174 new COVID-19 cases, an increase from the previous reporting week
- 20 new hospitalization, the same from the previous reporting week
- **0 new deaths**, the **same** from the previous reporting week
- 11 active outbreak in congregate care settings, an increase from the previous reporting week
- 411.2 new COVID-19 cases per 100k in the past two reporting weeks, an increase from the previous reporting week
- **57.2**% of all residents had initiated primary vaccination series; **51.9**% of all residents had completed primary vaccination series
- 215 individuals were tested at the Lewis County Mall Discovery Health Test Site in the current reporting week; 10,085 tests have been administered since the site opened on November 26, 2021.
