



COVID-19 WEEKLY UPDATE

Lewis County, WA | Reporting Week for April 8, 2022 to April 14, 2022

The COVID-19 vaccine is available to all people 5 years and older!

The first diagnosed case of COVID-19 in a Lewis County resident was reported on March 15, 2020.

As of April 14, 2022, Lewis County reported:

- **22 new COVID-19 cases**, a **decrease** from the previous reporting week
- **3 new hospitalization**, the **same** from the previous reporting week
- **0 new deaths**, the **same** from the previous reporting week
- **2 active outbreak** in congregate care settings, the **same** from the previous reporting week
- **56.1 new COVID-19 cases per 100k** in the past two reporting weeks, an **increase** from the previous reporting week
- **56.5%** of all residents had initiated vaccination; **51.2%** of all residents had been fully vaccinated
- **78** individuals were tested at the Lewis County Mall Discovery Health Test Site in the current reporting week; **8,651** tests have been administered since the site opened on November 26, 2021.

As of the reporting week of June 6 – June 12, 2021, total and new cases include diagnosed (molecular test) and probable (antigen test) cases with a specimen collection date during the current reporting week; probable case inclusion began December 16, 2020; LCPHSS does not report deaths until verified by receipt of a physician-signed death certificate stating COVID-19 as a cause of death. Congregate care settings include licensed facilities, such as nursing homes, assisted living, adult family homes, child care centers, schools, homeless shelters, jail, detention and other similar group care or placement settings. An outbreak involves two or more linked cases of COVID-19. The number of outbreaks reported does not equal the number of persons involved. As data is verified, numbers reported previously may change. We access data from multiple official sources; discrepancies from one source, or day, to another, is a reflection of differing operating procedures.
