DETECTIVES SERVE SEARCH WARRANT FOR NARCOTICS DISTRIBUTION

On August 17, 2023, detectives with the Lewis County Sheriff's Office served a search warrant in the 400 block of State Route 505, Winlock, in relation to a mid-level Fentanyl dealer. This investigation began when detectives received information illegal narcotics were being sold out of a travel trailer behind the residence. As a result of the investigation 112 Fentanyl pills, just under 4 ounces of Fentanyl powder, drug paraphernalia, US currency, scales, and packaging materials commonly associated with drug distribution were seized.

24 year old Macy Tayler Isabelle White of Winlock, was taken into custody and booked at the Lewis County Jail for Possession with Intent to Deliver of a Controlled Substance, Delivery of a Controlled Substance, and Maintaining a Building for Drug Purposes. 34 year old Shaun Lee Elliott and 30 year old Heather Nicole Scheiber, both of Longview, were referred on charges for additional control substance violations.

"This was excellent work by our deputies," said Sheriff Rob Snaza. "Our agency continues to strictly enforce controlled substance violations. With recent changes under RCW 69.50.4013, taking effect this week, we will once again have the ability to arrest individuals for simple possession of dangerous drugs regardless of prior referrals."
