Five New Lewis County COVID-19 Cases Reported

Chehalis, WA – Lewis County Public Health & Social Services (LCPHSS) announced today that five more Lewis County residents have tested positive for COVID-19. This brings the total number of Lewis County residents who have tested positive to 185 since the first case was reported on March 4, 2020

One of these five new patients is under age 10, one is under age 20, one is in their 20s, and two are in their 30s. None of these five are hospitalized today, however one patient reported earlier this week is now hospitalized. Three patients live in Commissioner District #1, and two live in District #2. New case totals by County Commissioner district are:

Twenty-one of the 185 total cases have been hospitalized at some time in their illness. Three of the 185 have died. Fifty-one of the 185 are considered recovered under the current definition of being alive and not hospitalized 28 days after symptoms began.

To date 5,890 Lewis County residents have been tested for COVID-19, an increase of 76 tests from the previous day. 185 residents (3.1%) have tested positive.
