Sex Offender Level III Notification

The Lewis County Sheriff's Office is releasing the following information pursuant to RCW 4.24.50, which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public when the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the Sheriff's Office. Further, their previous history places them in a classification level that reflects the potential to re-offend. The individual served the sentence imposed by the court and has properly notified the Sheriff's Office of their current address. The law does not require this offender to do anything other than register. **THEY ARE NOT WANTED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AT THIS TIME. Synopsis of Information: On 03/05/01, Brian L. Kim was convicted in Thurston County Superior Court for Rape in the 2nd Degree. This conviction stems from Kim having forced sexual contact with an unknown developmentally delayed male. Kim met the victim at a bus stop in Lewis County and Kim offered him a ride, which the victim accepted. Kim then drove the victim to his home in Thurston County where the assault took place, instead of the victim's destination. After the assault, Kim took the victim near his actual destination, told him not to tell anyone, and left. Kim was later identified when the victim showed family his residence

and Kim was arrested for the offense. As a result, he was sentenced to 102 months in prison. Based on the totality of this individual's crime, it has been determined that he presents a clear risk to the community and this notification is required.

Using this public information to threaten, intimidate or harass sex offenders will not be tolerated by the law enforcement agencies of Lewis County. This abuse could potentially terminate our ability to release this important information to the public.
